## What is Star Homework?

-Star homework allows you and your child to choose how much homework they will do nightly.

- Your child can choose to do one star or up to 3 stars per day! A minimum of 4 stars per week is required. Earning more than 4 stars can qualify students for rewards on Friday.


## Math Practice

Your student will be bringing home a fact practice sheet with instructions on how to time work. If you have internet they may choose either Xtra Math or a Scoot Pad Math lesson. Students will be taught in class how to use these online programs. ONE choice per day earns a star.

## Read

Students must read 15 minutes to earn a star. They may choose to read a book or if you have internet they may choose a Scoot Pad Language Arts or RazKids book to listen to or read to earn a star.
-Students may have additional required reading assignments included in their homework folder as needed

## WORD WORK ACTiViTies

Cross out the activity after you have completed it and bring your work to school with you to turn in.

Basic Word Sort:
Sort words based on spelling patterns. You should read aloud the words during this activity and be able to explain why the words are sorted in a particular way.

Challenge Sort:
Just like sort above but sorts
words according to meaning, syllables, types of
speech or other reasons.
Word Hunt:
Look for words in book that match the spelling pattern of your words.
Alphabetize:
Place each word in ABC order. If more than one word starts with the same letter, you will have to look to the $2^{\text {nd }}$ or $3^{\text {rd }}$ letter.

Sentences:
Write words in complete sentences.
